Shirley Op Shop is now open!





Family Violence has NO place in Shirley:

We are focusing on preventing family violence because community surveys showed it is important to residents.

Here are some of our local support options and initiatives:

Battered Women's Trust info session. Thursday 4th May, 9am–10am, at Emmett St Community Church Hall. Info about services, support, and answering questions. Open to all.

Family Harm support. Emma is a local family violence support person. She is available for a chat any Wednesday 11am to 12.30pm at the Neighbourhood Centre, 17 Acheson Ave, or ph 022 103 8351. On Wednesday 17th May she will be joined by Kim from The Loft (Eastgate).

Emma is also available at the Listening Post on Mondays.

Mailbox stickers. We have four types of stickers to support a family violence-free Shirley. Show your support by putting a sticker on your mailbox or car. Stickers are available from the Neighbourhood Centre.

CONNECTING WITH PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY

Caroline Ellis is a Public Health Nurse working in the Shirley area. We had a chat about her role and her passion to support families to have good health outcomes.

What is your role in the community?

My role is to help improve inequities and access to healthcare for children and families in the Shirley area, by being present within the area on a weekly basis.

What does a Public Health Nurse do?

We are Registered Nurses who have knowledge, experience and training in child/tamariki and family/whānau health. We work alongside children, young people, parents, caregivers and school staff. We can liaise with GPs, specialists and other service providers.

What would you like to see in this community?

For families with children who have health concerns that are impacting them at home or school to feel supported. This would be through a referral into the Public Health Nursing Service.

I would love to see the all the children and young people in the Shirley area engaged/enrolled with all the FREE health services that are available to them – for example Vision and Hearing checks, Dental enrolment, B4 School Checks, childhood vaccinations – I can help with this process.

What would you say to a Mum, Dad or caregiver who is hesitant about asking for help from a health professional?

I always say that no question is a silly one, and that you know your child better than anyone, so if you have concerns come and have a chat and I can work with you to figure out who best to speak to regarding your concern. Our conversation is confidential, and I'll discuss this with you at the beginning of our chat.

When and where are you available for people to meet you?

I will be at MacFarlane on the Park café most Fridays. If you get there and you can't find me, please message me or ask one of the staff to message me. My business card is on the notice board, my number is 027 687 2299.

What is an activity you enjoy doing and why?

Any time spent in the outdoors with my partner Matt and our two children is a favourite pastime. Be it at the beach on a hot day, biking in the forest or being up in the snow during the winter. Getting out in the fresh air is always a quick way to recharge and get going for the day.
