Free Energy Advice from CEA in Shirley! Are you struggling with high power bills? Is your house too cold to be comfortable? Not sure what to do about condensation? MONEY Jaimita from CEA (Community Energy Action) Charitable Trust will be at the MATTERS community café every second Friday (red A presentation on how to bin week) over the winter months for free make your money go further energy advice. Come and have a chat about the best ways to keep your house warm THIS MONTH'S TOPIC: and dry, and how to stay healthy at home. Kiwisaver Unwrapped -CEA has been working on energy efficiency in the community how the scheme works in for nearly 30 years, mostly for low-income households. I welcomed Dietrich to our awesome community.

### Where are you from?

Presently I live with my wife in Aranui. I have spent a lot of my life with my whanau in South Auckland. I was born in Samoa and lived for some of my childhood in Tonga. I do identify with my Tongan roots. And, as my name tells you I do have German heritage as well.

### What is your desire for your time in the Shirley community?

I want to be available and approachable to everyone, to give time, a listening ear, encouragement, and support. Every person has value and I want my presence to affirm that within them. I will be at the Café each Friday. I do have a big hairy audacious goal – that is to work with the community to have full attendance at all schools in Shirley for all our tamariki and rangatahi!

# You mentioned in our conversation that you are a Spoken Word Poet. I haven't heard of that before, tell me about it.

Spoken Word is a poetry that is meant to be performed for an audience, rather than just read on a page. I have performed this poetry in various countries, in pubs, churches, bus stops and with orchestras. In fact, I am organising a Spoken Word Inter-High School competition in Christchurch and so far, have six schools involved.

I ended my interview with asking Dietrich what he thinks is key to a good marriage/successful relationship. He thought for a time and then left me with these two quotes. "If we do not transform our pain, we will most assuredly transmit it" - Fr Richard Rohr. "It is not what happens to you; it is what happens inside you as a result of what happens to you" - Gabor Mate.
