

l recently had a chat with Michelle Dyer about her work at Nourish Ōraka

Tell me about your journey with Nourish Ōraka

Nourish Ōraka, which provides healthy school lunches to Shirley Primary School started 2 ½ years ago, and I have been there right from the very beginning. I hadn't worked for several years because I have fibromyalgia. Having a chronic illness had knocked my confidence. I had been doing volunteer work at Shirley Primary School, so when this job became available I applied and was successful. I started working 3 days a week, now I work 5 days a week and have taken on the Manager role.

What do you enjoy about your role?

I value that we are providing the tamariki of our community healthy school lunches, knowing that having a full tummy means they learn better and can achieve more. It's been great to be able to go to the school and get the children's feedback about what they would like in their lunches.

I find it satisfying that the extra lunches are given out to the people in the community, knowing the whole community is being blessed by our work.

I am passionate that each member of the awesome team at Nourish Ōraka is supported in their work and life, I want the place to be like 'a second home' for them, I want them to know they are valued, and their voice will always be listened to.

I have appreciated the opportunity of being part of LinC Incubator as I want to build my leadership skills so I can offer more to Nourish Ōraka and this awesome community that I enjoy being part of.
