### **Interview with Murray from Clearbrook Street**

A highlight of this past month was the time I spent with a long-time local resident, Murray. He and his wife moved into Clearbrook Street in 1967. They had one child at the time, and went on to have two more children, all of whom attended Briggston School. - Being a relative newbie to the area I had not known of Briggston School situated behind the Briggs Road shops which closed 2003!

Murray brought his house which was only 6-7 years old for 4450 pounds, around \$8900 today! Clearbrook Street was originally part of the Waimairi County Council, that then became a District Council, and in 1989 was amalgamated into the Christchurch City Council.

All around Clearbrook Street in 1967 were sand hills, swamps and some old trees. Clearbrook Street just went to 'nothing'. Behind their house horses grazed and his second daughter enjoyed riding them. The old macrocarpa trees behind his house attracted mappies, he would feed them cheese and they would even come inside for the cheese!

Murray reflects what a great street Clearbrook was to bring up a family. His children would play with the other children, everyone helped and looked out for each other. He enjoyed the community that was present. It was in the early days of television which was black and white!

Murray has had great enjoyment in rugby. One of his heroes in that sport is Don Clarke who had a phenomenal goal kicking ability which gave him the name 'The Boot'. It's his children, grandchildren and great grandchildren that give him much pride; Murray spoke of the 'amazing pleasure' he receives from his great grandchildren!

I left my time with Murray inspired by the respect and delight he had for people. His health has taken him to hospital over the past few years. He couldn't speak more highly of the doctors and nurses; they have all been so caring and supportive. A big shout out to all who work in health reading this, thank you for all you give.

Thank you Murray for sharing your memories, I know they will spark memories in those who read this as they did in me.
