Over the past few months, Shirley Community Trust has been working with Council, Civil Defence and other local organisations to create an action plan for a coordinated response to any future emergency events. We are nearly ready to share that with the community, but as a first step we would like to encourage you to get prepared in your own home.



Discuss with your household what to do in 🔾 the event of an emergency: meeting point, contact person, arrangements for children, etc



Aim to have 3 days supply of food, water, medications, baby care and pet food, plus a grab bag of clothes, torch or candles, battery pack, radio and essential documents, etc.

A slice of History - Street and place names

The Shirley area as we know it today did not extend much north of Shirley Road until after World War 2. Quinns Road was the only road between Hills Road and Marshland Road. There were only a few houses, and it was open paddocks. With that in mind I am focusing on streets just out of this area for this article giving us an idea of something of what life was like for people early last century.

Bampton Street just off New Brighton Road near the Palms Mall was named after the Bampton family who owned land in the area. The Bamptons were known as being nearly self-sufficient. They had cows which they milked by hand, a large orchard, hens and beehives. Roger Allan who authored the book 'The Christchurch Districts of Windsor and Shirley, A short history and reminiscences 1860-1960' recalls collecting the milk from the Bamptons dairy as a 6-year-old. There was a trough of water running through the dairy which kept the milk cooled as it was before the days of refrigerators. He muses that it was a challenge to bring the billy full of milk home each day and he often lost a lot on the way!

Near to Bampton Street are Achilles and Ajax Streets. Named after HMS Ajax and HMS Achilles, ships that served the Royal New Zealand Navy in the World War 2.

The area behind the Palms Mall became known as Windsor. This name came from a large two-storied house in Ajax Street which was called "Windsor" by its original owner a James Rowe from Cornwall. He arrived in the country in 1874 and bought land in Shirley and became a pig breeder. Roger Allan writes his Berkshire pigs were imported from Queen Victoria's stud in Windsor. This house still stands today.


Matariki - honouring the past, celebrating the future
