Changes to SCT Programmes for Term Two


Touch Rugby has finished for the season and will resume in September when daylight savings starts.

Then there are the City Libraries: Shirley Library at the Palms has a vast selection of books for all ages and also runs lots of activities for all ages including Babytimes, Storytimes, Card games, Scrabble and Mahjong groups. The Library also has a bus so they can take books to events in the community, like Storytime in the Park, and they are always at SHINE.



As well as the City Libraries, we are fortunate to have another small local library - Mairehau Library on Kensington Avenue. This community library is run by volunteers and opens Monday, Wednesday and Friday 12-4pm and Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday 10am-2pm. It has a great selection of books and DVDs for adults and children. Most books are 50c to borrow, new releases \$1 and children's books are free. The library is also home to many activities - a Knitting Group meets there each Tuesday morning, supporting 'Operation Cover Up' with their creations. Then on the first Monday of each month there is a Book Club where people share about the books they have been reading.

We deliver Sunshine in Shirley to every letterbox in our neighbourhood. We hope you value our newsletter more than advertising or junk mail.
