Scarlett Oak **Update!**

At the start of April we farewelled more than 20 oak trees from Emmett St that were not able to be made compliant with power lines, or had otherwise become insafe. We worked in with council to make sure as much material as possible could be kept for the community.

The community garden, the birdsong trail and the primary school all received mulch. In MacFarlane Park near the community garden you can see the beginnings of a nature play area which will be developed further. Logs have been stored with a view to milling for local projects. Offcuts and small pieces unable to be used for other projects will be added to the Shirley Firewood Club's stock. If you have ideas or want to be involved,
