Te Reo Interview with Cody and Tarryn

Cody Smith and Tarryn Ryan have been teaching te reo Māori beginners classes in Shirley for the last 4 years. They are stepping down from this voluntary role at the end of this year. We asked them a few questions:



Tell us a little about yourselves

Cody is from Rangiora and did not have much exposure to Te Ao Māori until in his mid-20's. An accountant by trade, he has worked in the corporate sector but prefers the non-corporate sector, now working for Big Brothers, Big Sisters.

Tarryn, Kāi Tahu/Ngāpuhi, from Motupōhue, spent 10 years living overseas and speaks German as well as Māori and English. She is a māmā, historian and kaiwhakahaere (organiser/manager) of Kōrero ki Ōtautahi – whose kaupapa is to support learners and speakers of te reo Māori and normalise reo usage around the city. Why have you been taking these te reo classes in Shirley for the last 4 years?

Cody said he learnt the language for free and wanted to give back to community.

Tarryn welcomed an opportunity to have more exposure to te reo and to create more opportunity in the community. So when asked by a friend if they could support these classes, they both put their hands up! The team approach has worked well, with Cody emphasising the grammar and structure of reo, and Tarryn the waiata and kēmu – songs and games. Both agree their level of reo has grown hugely through teaching!

What are you going on to do next year?

Cody is spending 6 months in Japan with his partner, working and learning Japanese.

Tarryn will still be in Christchurch, continuing the mahi of Kōrero ki Ōtautahi and her work as a historian.

Thank you Cody and Tarryn for your amazing koha - gift of te reo Māori classes in Shirley these last 4 years. Your generosity, knowledge and faithfulness in turning up every week has been a real blessing. We treasure you and wish you well in your future endeavours. Ngā mihi ki a kōrua.
